Plant a Salsa Garden!

Overview: For some children, salsa is a product bought in a grocery store or served with chips in a restaurant. Growing a salsa garden is an easy way to reinforce the concept that that food comes from plants. When gardening by age, with adult assistance and supervision, children can assume responsibility for the care of plants and in preparation of a simple recipe for salsa.

Children will learn:

- Food comes from plants.
- Plants have needs that must be met to produce healthy fruit (tomatoes and peppers), bulbs (onions), and leaves (cilantro).
- Follow a recipe and make a simple salsa.

Salsa Recipe

Ingredients from your garden

5 tomatoes. ½ cup fresh cilantro

1 jalapeño pepper 5 scallions

Optional ingredients: 1 clove chopped garlic, lime juice to taste, salt to taste Instructions:

Wash and dry produce. Dice the tomatoes. Slice open the jalapeño pepper and remove the seeds (unless you want it HOT). Dice the pepper. Chop the cilantro leaves. Thinly slice the scallions and discard the leaves. Mix the sliced and diced produce. Add optional ingredients, as desired.
